We are currently recruiting for a full-time Social Worker – 37.5 Hours per week

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Expansion of the existing grief and bereavement program to include groups for children, people who feel disenfranchised, and groups specifically for men.
- Expansion of our community outreach including facilitating workshops and holistic wellness programs increasing the understanding of death, dying, the grief process and improving coping skills to reduce its impact and feelings of isolation.
- Develop new programs to support those who are impacted by COVID-19 and other situations where social isolation caused disruption to the grieving process.
- Develop programs for Survivors of Suicide Loss, Substance Related Loss and those whose loved one had a Medical Assistance in Dying procedure.
- Seeking community partners to host workshops and sessions throughout the North Simcoe community.
- Expand workshops to include parents helping their children through grief, legacy work, art-based & music therapy, gentle yoga and mindfulness.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Registered Social Worker in good standing with the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers;
- Formal advanced courses in Hospice Palliative Care is considered an asset;
- Minimum of five years social work experience with a focus on grief, geriatrics, mental health;
- Must be flexible in hours of work for evening or weekend sessions.
- French Language and/or Indigenous Cultural Awareness are considered strong assets.
